Example of Old Testament Textual Criticism

II Samuel 21:19

ַנְרָ אַלְחָנָן בֶּן־יַעְרֵי אֹרְגִים בָּית הַלַּחְמִי אֵת גָּלְיָת הַגּּהִּי וְעֵץ חֲנִיתוֹ כִּמְנָוֹר אֹרְגִים:

Elhanan the son of Jaare-oregim, the Bethlehemite, struck down Goliath the Gittite, the shaft of whose spear was like a weaver's beam. (ESV)

I Chronicles 20:5

וַצַּךְ אֶלְחָנָן בֶּן־יָעוּר אֶת־לַחְמִי אֲחִי גָּלְיָת הַגִּתִּי וְצַץ חָנִיתֹו כִּמְנַור אֹרְגִים

Elhanan the son of Jair struck down Lahmi the brother of Goliath the Gittite, the shaft of whose spear was like a weaver's beam. (ESV)

Proposed Original Text

אָחִי נֶּלְיָת הַגִּתִּי וְצֵץ חֲבִיתֹוֹ כִּמְלָוֹר אֹרְגִים וַיַּׁךְ אֶלְחָנָן בֶּן־יַעְרֵי אֹרְגִים בֵּית הַלַּחְמִי

Elhanan the son of Jaare-oregim, the Bethlehemite, struck down the brother of Goliath the Gittite, the shaft of whose spear was like a weaver's beam.

Note that I Chronicles leaves out 7 letters shortening the name of Jaare-oregim to Jair and turning "the Bethlehemite" into the name Lahmi.

Also note that II Samuel turns אחי "brother of" into the definite direct object marker את .
